
Digital Archive

Immersive Tours



Step inside and take a virtual tour of historic spaces with decoratively painted walls. Examine the walls and details at your own pace, and read and learn as you go.

The Digital Archive has been designed to share detailed information about painted walls created between 1790 to 1860. With nearly five hundred documented locations with multiple high-resolution images and written descriptions for each location, the site is designed to grow as discoveries are made and additional researchers' information is added.


